Letter from the Pastor

**Dear Northminster Family,** 

In the Northminster calendar, summer is our time to relax into community. While we have plenty of options planned, there are many ways to enter into summer relaxation within our city. Be sure to spend some time resting and reflecting this summer. Find ways to rejuvenate, and gain the strength that we will all need in the coming year.

Summer also leads us into different paths along our preaching journey as well. We align our texts closely with the liturgical calendar through Lent and Eastertide. In the summer, we give ourselves permission to stretch out throughout the canon of Scripture. This summer we will begin a series on The Ten Commandments, and Other Lessons from the Wilderness. This will be a chance to revisit the importance of the law of Moses. We will be asking ourselves, how and why did these "words" become central in the life and order of Israel? Interestingly, in the Book of Exodus and Deuteronomy, the Ten Commandments are listed as "words." They take on great importance because lest we think they are "just words," they are actually words that come from the very speech of God. From that point, they take on great weight within the books of Scripture. The Psalms, the Prophets, and Jesus himself point back to this tradition of the Mosaic Law to remind the people of how they are to live.

As we move into this series, old movie versions of the Ten Commandments might come to mind. You might also be thinking about how the commandments have interacted with culture. Maybe some of you remember learning the commandments in the public school system. All of these memories and thoughts can be brought to bear in this series. Alongside all of this, we will be wondering how the commandments can function for us today? Are they a lamp to our feet and light for our path? Are they better than life? (Both of these questions come from the way the commandments are spoken about in the Psalms). How can we talk about them today in a way that holds meaning and purpose?

We will have many voices in the pulpit this summer. I believe this is a great opportunity to celebrate the gifted minds and preachers that we have in our community. We'll have the privilege of hearing about peace making in South Africa from Kathryn Smith Derksen herself!

As many of us take various journeys throughout the summer, let us look forward our return to community here at Northminster!


Our next scheduled event is July 11<sup>th</sup> and we will have a Baseball watch party for the All-Star game. (Which we are currently looking for a place that can host for us)


### **Bible Study:**
