Welcome Pastor Jeny!

In September, the Northminster session voted unanimously to call Jeny Carlson as a Temporary Associate Pastor for Formation and Outreach. Jeny has been a part of our congregation for a few years and has been certified for ordained call since March of 2017. She will be formally examined by the Seattle Presbytery in January and ordained shortly after that. Her call is a bi-vocational temporary call which means she must have employment elsewhere and her position is approved for one year, and re-evaluated every year by the session. Jeny's role at NPC will include all communications, as well as providing direction to our Formation and Outreach events and programs.



Jeny comes to NPC with a background as a science teacher, ministry work with youth and young adults, and hospice chaplaincy. Currently, Jeny works for Adult Protective Services

when not serving at Northminster. She has a passion for how people develop spiritually over the course of their entire lifetime, believing that our faith formation does not stop when we graduate high school or college, but is constantly being challenged and deepened as we move through the normal events of daily living.

Along with her family (husband Lars and children, Annika (16), Erika (14), and Gunnar (12)), Jeny has a love of Star Wars and Marvel comics/movies. Her favorite superhero is Captain America and she will talk endlessly about the perfection of *The Black Panther* movie if you let her. Among her varied talents, she is an avid knitter, a USA Swimming Official, and a pop-culture fanatic. She brings a commitment to lived community, progressive theology, and social justice.

What is Faith Formation? In the most simplistic terms, it's the process by which our faith develops across our lifetimes. With young people, this has often meant learning certain prayers or scripture verses, and hearing stories or songs that attempt to give kids a way of understanding concepts like grace, sin, redemption, and resurrection. All those very concrete skills and parables are ways of entering into relationship with God.

Maintaining that relationship, nurturing it, challenging it, growing in it, is the work of our entire lives and the basis of our spiritual growth. God continues to meet us exactly where we are, ready to dive deep into the concerns, fears, hopes, and joys of our hearts.

In the coming weeks and months, I hope to provide space here, and through classes and workshops, to cultivate various ways we can further our faith formation. The regular practices of prayer, scripture study, and worship are the foundation upon which we build, and we also must be willing to take some risks as we explore who God is and how God has revealed the Truth of love, peace, and justice to the world.

There will be an Adult Formation class in December and if there are particular topics, practices, or questions that you wish to explore, please email me or stop me after worship and let me know what is on your heart!

October 2018 Treasurer's Report


At this point in the year, Income, which includes giving to the general fund, rent from the manse, and building use fees, is running behind where we predicted we'd be at this point in the year. General fund giving by the congregation, which makes up the majority of our income, has been generous this year. And, as is often the case, giving has slowed over the summer and is the primary driver for the deficit we see in this report.

As we all consider our stewardship and charitable giving, let's consider three things. Donations in 2018 will help meet our current year expenses. Estate planning gifts can cement our long-term support and help Northminster after we're gone. 
On the Expense side, we are slightly under the budget we projected for this point in the year. This is because we have incurred fewer major maintenance expenses this year than we budgeted for and our payroll is a little under budget for the year due to staffing transitions.

Here is another view of Northminster income and expenses through the year, showing how income and expenses flow on a monthly basis in 2018 (and 2017 for comparison):


